



Process

We screen a database of over 3,000 stocks and trust units. Those securities with adequate liquidity are tested and ranked according to their earnings characteristics. Specifically, we look for the rate of change in reported earnings and reported earnings in relation to expected earnings. The securities are further screened for strong fundamentals and attractive technical indicators. The securities that best pass these tests are selected as long positions for the Fund. Those companies that screen the worst are selected as short positions for the Fund. Each position in the portfolio, long or short, is monitored on a continuous basis. Should any security no longer meet our investment criteria, the position is sold or covered accordingly.

Commentary

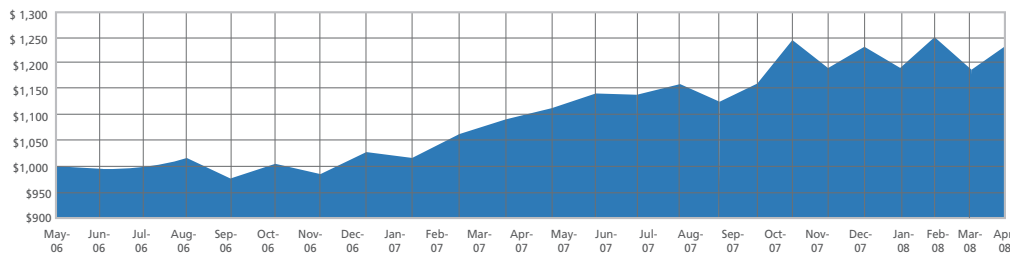
Once again, the month proved very volatile as the Fund rocketed up in the first half of the month only to correct in the latter half. Much of this volatility stems from the scarcity of stocks with positive earnings momentum. With a weak domestic economy, commodity companies that are benefiting from strong global demand are delivering the best results.

The Fund remains long agriculture, energy, steel, coal, iron ore, solar, and selective technology names. After a spectacular rise in these names, many corrected 10% to 30% as fears of an end to the commodity boom materialized. These fears are a normal and regular occurrence despite overwhelming statistical and fundamental evidence to the contrary.

Although the US looks to be in a recession, oil prices continue to rise. Over the next 5 years, demand for crude oil by non-OECD countries is expected to increase from 34 million bbl/d to 40 million bbl/d, while demand by OECD countries is expected to decline from 43.8 million bbl/d to 39 million bbl/d. The point is clear. A slow down in the US economy has a small effect on total demand for oil and little effect on oil prices. Americans might trade-in their Range Rovers for hybrids, but any resulting decline in oil demand will be replaced by even more new TATA drivers in India.

The fund is short forest products, grocery stores, retailers, airlines, and auto parts names.
